## What Does It Cost To Raise A Child?



According to the US Department of Agriculture (USDA), the average cost of raising a child born in 2013 up until age 18 for a middle-income family (earning between $\$ 61,530$ and $\$ 106,540$ a year) in the US is approximately $\$ 245,340$, according to the latest annual "Cost of Raising a Child" report. That equates to roughly \$12,800 = \$14,970 per child per year for a two-parent family with median income.

The annual cost can vary based on factors like the child's age, the number of children in the family and the family's income and location. Families earning less than $\$ 61,530$ per year can expect to spend $\$ \mathbf{1 7 6 , 5 5 0}$ on a child from birth to age 18. Families earning more than $\$ 106,540$ can expect to spend $\mathbf{\$ 4 0 7 , 8 2 0}$ from birth to age 18.
